ACTIVITIES

- 1) Coordinated and conducted multiple treatment AA meetings for the Exodus Program (Sundays at 8PM) with two other volunteers. Monthly AA circuit speaker CD is extremely well-received. ONGOING.
- 2) Received a verbal report from the Thursday night Treatment Meeting volunteer for the Exodus Program. Meetings still going well. ONGOING.
- 3) Received a verbal report of the Tuesday step meeting. Meetings are going well. Inmates are working the 12 steps. ONGOING.
- 4) Once again, followed up with TGC Intake Triage Unit (Detox Center) staff. Major staff changes. Talked to 4 staff members in person. Reminded them of the "Hope: Alcoholics Anonymous" video. Asked them to take a look at it for themselves. They are still interested in AA meetings, but cannot schedule regularly. They have not called. Provided them with several hundred Bridging-the-Gap business cards.
- 5) Called Bridging-the-Gap phone number, no answer, no follow-through. Will investigate.

OPEN ISSUES

- 1) Find alternate Treatment Coordinator.
- 2) Follow up with TGC Intake Triage Unit (Detox Center) staff. Remind them of the benefits of showing the "Hope: Alcoholics Anonymous" video. Follow up on the Bridging-the-Gap usage, and find out if they need more business cards.
- 3) Finish coordination discussion regarding an AA meeting at the Halo House (Northland Family Help Center for women). There are 3 women that are willing to facilitate.
- 4) Compile 7 remaining literature treatment literature kits.
- 5) Distribute remainder of treatment literature kits and orient remainder of treatment volunteers.
- 6) Contact additional inpatient treatment resources regarding literature, Treatment Contacts, and the desire to conduct an AA meeting at their facility (will work with CPC on this task).
- 7) Obtain Treatment Contacts for Exodus Program (must be jail certified).
- 8) Continue cooperating with Intergroup on "Bridging-the-Gap".
- 9) Write guidelines for the local "Bridge-the-Gap" programs, establishing differences in conduct and requirements for the Detention Center vs. Treatment Facilities.
- 10) Follow up with Northern Arizona Healthcare Behavioral Health Services (possibly write letter).
- 11) Follow up with Loyaltan of Flagstaff (possibly write letter).
- 12) Follow up with The Peaks (possibly write letter).
- 13) Create a Bridge the Gap Form for Northern AZ for both Treatment and Corrections.
