More Adolescents May Need Treatment:

Long-term heavy use of alcohol in adolescence alters brain function, according to a new study from the University of Eastern Finland and Kuopio University Hospital. The authors suggest that the clinical benchmarks used to define whether a young person needs alcohol treatent may set be too high. The study found that alcohol use cause significant alterations in both electrical and chemical neurotransmission among the study participants. For young people whose brain is still developing, heavy alcohol use is especially detrimental. The findings of the study warrant the question of whether diagnostic criteria for substance abuse disorders whould be tighter for adolescents, and whether they should be more easily referred to treatment.


